Post Fundraiser Report

Our 5th annual SBS Wheelchair Challenge was a resounding success, raising R550,175.40 exceeding the target of R500,000—to support people living with disabilities. Our CEO Delayne Gray led the event by spending 14 hours in a wheelchair on March 14th 2025, and the day featured wheelchair basketball matches and other activities to raise funds and awareness.

A charity golf day fundraiser hosted by QD Fire in the Western Cape concluded the 2025 challenge. A total of 18 wheelchairs have been donated to those in need, with significant support and funds provided to NPOs and PBOs in our communities. The fundraiser's success underscores the importance of inclusion and continued efforts to assist individuals with disabilities.

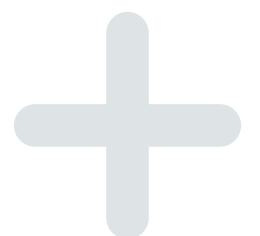

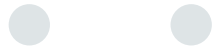
In addition to supporting the organisations listed above, funds raised and wheelchairs bought during the SBS Wheelchair Challenge have been used to support individuals with mobility challenges.
